	Why this and why now?	Better to do exam in Y10 than leave until Y11. Pupils can concentrate on this exam as only one they sit in Y10 (previous exam results have supported our assumption that 10s are not disadvantaged by doing exam a year early). LO1 and LO2 first as there is no tangible need to deliver any one unit first as they are very much units on their own, without massive opportunities to interleave across all 4 units.	For the reasons mentioned in HT1 and for ease of continuity with teaching resources we follow LO1 and 2 from HT1 with LO3 and LO4 in HT2	Exam takes place in first 2 weeks of January and then we move to R056. R056 culminates in an outdoor expedition and the weather in the summer is best suited to this, hence completing this unit in HT3 - HT5. Also, it would not be ideal trying to fit in an outdoor expedition during Y11 as the preparation for exam season begins early. L01 is delivered first as it is an introduction to outdoor activities, exploring the different types available to people and so it acts as a great starting point.	Completion of LO1. Provision for outdoor activities LO2 looks at the benefits of participating in outdoor activities. This knowledge needs to proceed the planning and delivery of an outdoor activity as advised in the specification.	This knowledge of how to develop skills will be important to LO3 when students are asked to plan an outdoor activity session. The specification states that students should clearly draw upon knowledge/skills/understanding of LO1 and LO2. LO3-The activity needs to be planned before the students can deliver a safe, effective session which will be delivered in LO4.
