Mrs Reeve is the career adviser from **Positive Steps** working at Copley Academy.

The Careers Library is based in the back of LRC on Mondays, alternate Tuesdays and Wednesdays. The Careers Library has its own set of PCs dedicated for career research and an extensive range of reading material about jobs and different career pathways.

Mrs Reeves offers a drop-in service to all pupils on a Monday after school and Wednesday lunch time in the LRC. Pupils do not need an appointment. Pupils are welcome to ask questions about careers, colleges and apprenticeships.

Pupils should check the career board outside the LRC for regular updates on career, college and apprenticeship information.

Positive Steps provide career guidance interviews to Y10/Y11 pupils and targeted interviews with KS3 students. Pupils are encouraged to;

- Talk through career ideas.
- Supported to manage and plan their future career goals.
- Explore possibilities they may never have considered, raise aspirations and inspired to aim high.
- Information and advice on colleges/sixth forms, courses and higher education.
- Information on how to apply for apprenticeships at 16 and other work -based learning opportunities.
