The English Baccalaureate is a performance measure that was introduced in 2010 by the government. It recognises the success of students who attain GCSEs at grades 9-5 across a core of academic subjects:

The government want students to take these core academic subjects and bring about greater fairness of opportunity.

It is felt that success across a broad range of subjects, such as these, provides a secure foundation for more advanced academic learning later in life.

As such, our options system allows students to take all of the courses to qualify for the Ebacc.
