





The English Baccalaureate is a performance measure that was introduced in 2010 by the government. It recognises the success of students who attain GCSEs at grades 9-5 across a core of academic subjects:

It is felt that success across a broad range of subjects, such as these, provides a secure foundation for more advanced academic learning later in life.

As such, our options system allows students to take all of the courses to qualify for the Ebacc.


This depends upon-
